1. General framework of the OPEN DAYS 2009

1.1 Introduction

In the space of just six years the OPEN DAYS have become a key event at which cities and regions have provided practical evidence of their capacity for creating growth and jobs, implementing European Union cohesion policy in such a way as to achieve the best results.

Conceived and developed by the EU Committee of the Regions and the European Commission Directorate-General for Regional Policy, this communication platform has enlisted loyal support from over 7 000 local, regional, national and European decision-makers and experts, whose achievements have been manifold in the areas of economic success and social integration, cooperation between regions, fruitful partnerships between local and regional authorities and businesses, and centres of excellence with research centres and universities.

OPEN DAYS 2009 will consist of several events such as seminars, workshops, exhibitions, networking fora, etc. for about 7,000 international participants. The purpose of this information pack is to explain how OPEN DAYS 2009 will be organised and lay out some of the roles and tasks for the organisers, regional partners and other partners involved in order to create a common understanding and to facilitate the event's management, its quality and its communication.

1.2 Purpose of the OPEN DAYS

The purpose of the event is multiple: First, it brings together political representatives, decision makers, experts and practitioners of regional policy as well as stakeholders from banking, business, civil society organisations, academia, EU institutions and the media to discuss common challenges for European regions and cities and debate possible solutions. Second, it provides a platform for capacity building to those involved in implementing EU cohesion policy and in managing its financial instruments. Third, the event aims at facilitating cooperation and networking among regions and cities on good practice in regional development. And finally, it offers the opportunity to debate the European cohesion policy of tomorrow in a wider context involving recent research and views from third countries and international organisations.

1.3 Main themes and context for the OPEN DAYS 2009

The seventh OPEN DAYS event, to be held on 5-8 October 2009, will be the opportunity to convey to the European institutions how partner regions and cities are responding to the global economic crisis.

Next autumn, the European agenda will be particularly suitable for an initiative of this kind: a new Parliament will have been elected and the current Commission (2004-2009) will be coming to an end. Discussion on the EU's political priorities and review of its budget after 2013 will also well be underway. Regions and cities will play a major role in the discussions, and the OPEN DAYS are an ideal framework for them to convey the importance of maintaining forceful, effective cohesion policy which will ensure sustainable development, present research and innovation projects, develop human capital and yield projects for cooperation between regions.

The 4 themes therefore for OPEN DAYS 2009 will be regions and climate change, restoring growth, territorial cooperation, and the impact and future of EU cohesion policy. The four priorities will be grouped under one **general headline: Global challenges, European responses.**

1. Restoring Growth: Innovation in Europe's regions and cities

With increasing global economic challenges and uncertainty, it is clear that globalisation has changed the world economic order, bringing new opportunities and new challenges. To compete, Europe's regions must become more inventive, react quicker and address global and environmental challenges by

innovating more. Possible topics under this theme include: a) Innovating through EU cohesion policy; b) Knowledge Transfer: university and industry at work in Europe's regions; c) Financing innovation with EU funding; d) Innovation and territorial cooperation; e) Innovation and Information Society.

2. Regions and climate change: Europe's way

The EU has set itself ambitious targets to fight climate change and promote renewable energy up to 2020 and beyond. Much of the burden will fall on Europe's regions. Possible topics under this theme include: a) Regional strategies to tackle climate change; b) Renewable energies; c) Financing energy efficiency measures through EU cohesion policy.

3. Territorial cooperation: Working together across borders

In 2009, the evaluation of cohesion policy's programmes of the 2000-2006 period will become available. Showing results and measuring the impact are key aspects in the cohesion policy cycle. It also helps to provide a clearer framework in which proposals for cohesion policy after 2013 can develop. Possible topics under this theme could include: a) Cross-border cooperation; b) Inter-regional cooperation; c) Sharing good practice inside and outside Europe.

4. Achieving results, looking ahead: EU cohesion policy's evaluation and future prospects

2009 will see the submission of most if not all evaluation of cohesion policy programmes of the 2000-2006 period. This is clearly a key aspect of the cohesion policy cycle in that it contributes in measuring the impact and results of cohesion policy. It also helps to provide a clearer framework in which any proposals for cohesion policy after 2013 can develop. Possible topics under this theme could include: a) Key findings from the ex-post evaluations 2000-2006; b) The ex-post evaluation process: lessons learned; c) Cohesion policy post-2013.

1.4 Event partners

The event partners are: the organisers, the regional partners and other partners.

- **Organisers.** The OPEN DAYS event is co-organised by the Committee of the Regions (CoR) and the Commission's Directorate-General for Regional Policy (DG REGIO). The organisers are responsible for the design, structure and overall programme of the event, the coordination of its preparation and communication with all partners. The organisers provide certain infrastructure within the limits of their possibilities and share the costs in roughly equal parts. On the basis of successful cooperation during previous events with the European Parliament Committee on Regional Policy (REGI Committee), the partnership with Parliament will be extended to other EP Committees associated with the event's themes.
 - The Swedish Council presidency will be closely involved in these initiatives in regions and has already included the Brussels event in its agenda.
 - The Commission Directorate-General for Communication will actively support regional and local events through its Representations in the Member States and information networks.
 - As in previous years, the other Commission Directorate-Generals will be invited to take part in the programme as well.

- **Regional partners.** The group of OPEN DAYS 2009 regional partners represent the European regions and cities that have been selected by the organisers following a call for interest and have the right to use the label "official partners". They are presented by representatives of one lead office and two deputies located in Brussels. They have agreed to contribute to the OPEN DAYS 2009 programme through events in Brussels and events in their regions or cities (local events), for which they will be responsible in terms of content and organisation.
- **Financial institutions, business and civil society partners** are invited to propose sessions as part of the OPEN DAYS programme and to participate in the ongoing exhibition events (OPEN DAYS-The Meeting Place).

Finally, third countries and international organisations will be invited by the organisers to contribute to a special series of seminars on the international dimension of regional policy.

Note: The organisers have the right to exclude regional partners and other partners from the list of event partners in case tasks as defined below will not be fulfilled on time.

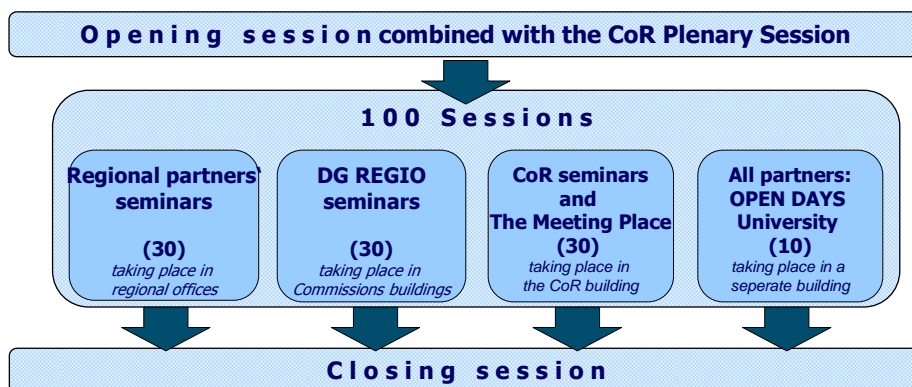
1.5 Events in Brussels

The OPEN DAYS 2009 events in Brussels between 5 and 8 October will be structured around three main pillars:

- A programme of some 100 **sessions** (seminars, workshops and debates) over three days constitutes the core of the event
- Formal events:** Opening Session combined with the CoR Plenary Session, Official Reception, , European Parliament conference(s), Closing Session
- OPEN DAYS-The Meeting Place** (sessions, informal meetings and networking): The themes of the ‘**Meeting Place**’ are the same as the ones of the **OPEN DAYS 2009**, but the the seminars will be organised by private partners (companies or financial institutions). In 2009, there will be no thematic villages, only temporary exhibitions/stands around the seminars.

In 2009, the Opening Session of the OPEN DAYS 2009 will coincide with the beginning of the Plenary Session of the Committee of the Regions on Monday 5 October, 15:00-17:00.

This programme is developed and hosted in roughly equal parts by the regional partners, DG REGIO and the CoR in cooperation with other partners (representatives from banking & business, civil society groups and Commission Directorates-General)



The sessions form the core of the event. For the **regional partners** they provide an opportunity to exchange experience and good practice and to facilitate cooperation and networking. While respecting the format, thematic priorities and quality standards defined by the organisers, regional partners are autonomous as regards logistics and contents of their sessions.

DG REGIO sessions will focus on the future debate of European cohesion policy as well as on its impact and future, and in particular for 2009, on the results of the ex-post evaluations of the 2000-2006 period.

The **CoR** has a key role in guiding the content of the event and in coordinating the sessions on offer from 'OPEN DAYS The Meeting Place' (representatives of business & banking, civil society organisations and European Commission DGs).

Finally, all partners contribute to a new set of seminars forming the '**OPEN DAYS University**'. In this context, a selected number of professors from universities from different European countries which are specialised in urban and regional studies will be invited to hold a number of joint lectures and seminars which will be open for other participants as well. The OPEN DAYS University will be hosted in a separate venue.

Each session has to address one of the four thematic priorities and produce conclusions. The latter will feed into the overall conclusions of the OPEN DAYS.

All event partners cooperate and contribute to safeguarding the quality of the OPEN DAYS 2009. To this end, the event partners ensure presence at the preparatory meetings on organisational and other aspects.

1.6 Local events: Europe in our region/city

In an effort to get even closer to the citizens – and in support of the Commission Directorate- General for Communication's ambition to "Communicate Europe in Partnership" - each participating region and city is requested to organise at least one event on their home ground during the month of October 2009 under the label and graphic chart for "**Europe in our Region/City**".

These events target the general public, potential beneficiaries of the Structural Funds and expert audiences. They can be organised within the framework of the communications plans of cohesion policy programmes 2007-2013. These events can also be organised in conjunction with the launch of Structural Funds projects or in the framework of the annual information events which are required by the Structural Funds regulations.

Beyond the regional partners, other interested regions, cities or organisations will also be invited to propose local events in the framework of the OPEN DAYS 2009. Local organisers other than those proposed by the regional partners will have to apply including a description of the events planned which should be clearly linked to the OPEN DAYS themes before they are entitled to use the local events logo.

In this context, regional partners and other organisers are requested to co-operate with the European Commission's representations or delegations and communication networks in their respective countries/regions. In addition, special efforts should be made in order to raise awareness of regional and local media.

Final information about the local events including title, description including target groups and speakers, date and venue will be provided by the regional partners to the organisers by **8 May 2009**.

1.7 Target audience - Individual participants

Individual participants will be invited to register for participation in any of the working sessions included in the final programme.

This event would appeal to the following categories of individual participants:

- National, regional and local politicians
- Members of the Committee of the Regions, the European Parliament and of the European Economic & Social Committee
- Officials of European, national, regional and local administrations and experts in the field of managing and evaluating Cohesion Policy programmes
- Business and banking sector managers and representatives of European and national business federations
- Public and private business and banking representatives
- Representatives of NGOs and civil society organisations
- Representatives of European and national association of local and regional authorities
- Journalists from European, national, regional and local media

2. Conditions of participation & organisational details

2.1 Introduction

The Committee of the Regions (CoR) and European Commission's DG for Regional Policy (DG REGIO) hereby invite Europe's regions and cities to apply to participate in the OPEN DAYS 2009.

The OPEN DAYS event has enlisted loyal support from some 7 000 participants and gives a high profile to 200 partner regions and cities. Following the evaluation and experience of the last six years, the organisers intend to respond to the expectations of their partners by designing a lighter and a more flexible agenda for these four days in Brussels. That is why the organisers are streamlining the programme to make it more appealing.

This seventh event will therefore be a chance to give the OPEN DAYS fresh impetus, prioritising:

- the quality of content and speakers at the conferences and seminars held in Brussels, which will be fewer and more targeted; while still informative they will also be conducive to networking between partners and participants;
- the local expression of the event in partner regions and cities, each of which has to organise at least one communication or information initiative on their home ground during the OPEN DAYS period;
- opening the event up to partners from the business and banking sectors and from civil society, by enhancing and building on the OPEN DAYS - The Meeting Place concept, as the hub for exchange and networking between public and private sector.

The aim is to select not more than 200 official partners from regions and cities and to organise not more than 100 workshops in total.

2.2 Conditions for participation

In order to become an "official partner" of the OPEN DAYS, regions and cities have to fulfil conditions as specified below under points 2.2.1 to 2.2.5.

2.2.1 Condition 1: Eligibility

Eligibility of the partners will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- 1) Regions must have a representation office in Brussels.
- 2) As a general rule, cities must:
 - a. have a representation office in Brussels; or
 - b. be a capital of a Member State; or
 - c. be a capital of a NUTS I or II region; or
 - d. have a minimum of 500,000 inhabitants.
- 3) Regions and cities eligible under points 1) and 2) must be members of a regional partnership (group) established for that purpose together with other regions and cities.
- 4) European regions/cities may not apply and be part of more than one regional partnership.

2.2.2 Condition 2: Regional partners

In order to establish a regional partnership the following criteria have to be met:

1. Regional partners must comprise at least five and not more than twelve European regions/cities which fulfil the above eligibility criteria and represent at least four different countries.
2. Regional partners have to be headed by a 'lead office' and a 'deputy office' that are responsible for managing the tasks within the regional partnership.
3. The lead office has to appoint a nominative person, that will be responsible throughout the entire period of preparing the event and for communicating with the organisers. This person must be seconded by a deputy.
4. Regional partners must be in a position to make available one joint venue for the organisation of their working sessions. This venue should be located in the European quarter of Brussels and should be able to accommodate at least 90 people.
5. All event partners will contribute to the OPEN DAYS 2009 programme through seminars, local events, exhibition stands or other activities. They are required to follow the common concept of themes, timing and communication, which aims at delivering an event of high quality.
6. All event partners should be personally represented during the common preparatory meetings to which the organisers will invite and ensure the information is forwarded as fast as possible to other parties concerned.

2.2.3 Condition 3: Quality of proposed Brussels sessions

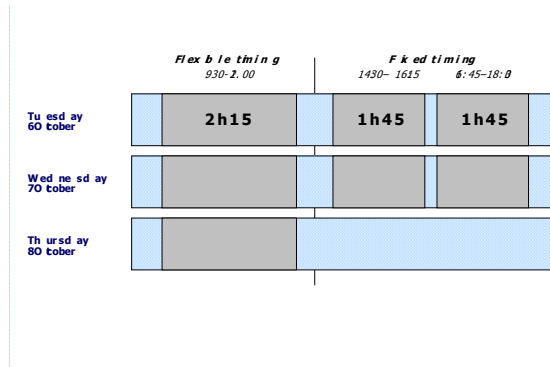
Each regional partnership is expected to organise at least one and not more than two session(s) in Brussels as specified below. Each event is to be classified according to the typology (seminar/workshop/debate) and thematic priorities mentioned in 1.3. These events will form part of the programme that will be coordinated by the CoR and DG REGIO. Partners will be selected based on the evaluation of the quality of the events proposed, including their content, speakers and the link to the event's thematic priorities.

The programme of **sessions** (as described in 1.6.) will run for three days, starting on Tuesday 6th October in the morning and ending on Thursday, 8th October at lunchtime.

The **typology** for the sessions is the following:

- Seminars presenting information, offering training, in particular related to implementation of cohesion policy and the management of its financial instruments;
- Workshops presenting experience and good practice (facilitating cooperation and networking) with ample opportunity for contributions from the audience.
- Debates meant to be animated on specific aspects involving a group of experts and a moderator while avoiding presentations and speeches and instead building on the expertise of an informed public.

The sessions would fit into three **timeslots**:



A single morning session (2h15) anytime between 9:30 and 13:00 will provide ample opportunity for networking, whereas two shorter (1h45) afternoon sessions will be better adapted to more formal sessions. The exact timing of the morning session is always flexible within the indicated time span, whereas the timing of the afternoon sessions is strictly fixed.

The morning session could also include a 3½ time slot for a double workshop/seminar (with a short break) around one particular theme.

To ensure that seminars are organised in most effective and useful manner, the following should be taken into account :

- seminars are clearly described, including an indicated agenda and dedicated to specific target groups;
- within a timeframe of about 2 hours seminars and workshops should consist of not more than four presentations and debate should not involve more than six panellists in order to leave enough time for discussion with the audience;
- speakers and moderators are carefully selected, briefed and supported when preparing their contribution; in
- contributions focus on issues transferable to other regions avoiding long project or institutional descriptions;
- the number of contributions in each seminar and the time allocated to speakers provides sufficient time for debate with the audience;
- seminars are chaired and moderated in a way which encourages debate and exchange.

NEW FOR 2009

The number of speakers should not exceed 4 per session. One of the most often repeated comments in evaluations of past events is that participants felt that the number of speakers per session had been excessive and that no time was left for discussion.

These aspects will be discussed in more detail between organisers, regional partners and other partners. If necessary, guidance papers such as practical details for speakers or technical sheets for setting up the seminars will be provided in order to help prepare the OPEN DAYS 2009 seminars.

2.2.4 Condition 4: Quality of proposed local events

Each member of a regional partnership has to organise a programme of local event(s) under the theme **Europe in our region/city**, scheduled for October 2009 in its home territory. During the OPEN DAYS 2008 a programme of 220 local events in 31 countries was organised by participating regions (see www.opendays.europa.eu for more details on local events in 2008).

Other regions, cities and organisation can contribute to the local events of the OPEN DAYS 2009 as well.

Under the heading of the four main themes of the OPEN DAYS the aim is to attract a wide range of participants and including policy-makers and experts. NGOs, the media, the general public as well as schools and universities are welcome to find out more about the impact of Europe on their region and city and to attend the events.

The choice of format of the event is very free, and organisers are advised to

- involve Members of the European Parliament (with the support of the European Parliament Information Office in their Member State)
- involve Members of the Committee of the Regions
- liaise with Europe Direct Centres
- draw in regional media, providing them with the event logo
- cooperate with the Managing Authorities of the European Social and Regional Development Funds
- work with Commission Representations in the Member States and its Delegations in other countries

The Europe Direct Centres and Commission's Representations and Delegations can help provide support in logistics, documentation and promotion but also in finding speakers, experts and EU representatives.

Regional media should also be encouraged by the regional partners to attend and report on the local events.

Each regional partnership should appoint one contact person who will be responsible for local events on behalf of the whole regional partnership.

2.2.5 Condition 5: Technical data

When applying, conglomerates must provide the following items which will be used for production of promotional tools for the event and that will provide visibility to each participating region/city:

- completed application forms¹ (Annexe I² or Annexe II³ including session description)

- one photo from each partner region/city (300 dpi for 10 x 12 cm **OR** 3MB jpg.file), with a one-line caption/description in English
- the logo/sign in eps.format for each partner regions/cities (eps.file **OR** alternatively a 2MB jpg file)
- one photo of the place of each of the local event (300 dpi for 10 x 12 cm **OR** 3MB jpg.file), with an one-line caption/description in English

The above mentioned items form an integral part of the application and must be submitted in both a) printed (paper) and b) electronic versions (on a CDRom).

2.3 Organisational details

Timeline for the preparation of the OPEN DAYS 2009:

2.4 Participation of regions/cities in ‘OPEN DAYS – The Meeting Place’

Regions/cities forming part of a selected regional partnership will be invited to participate individually in the **OPEN DAYS The Meeting Place** seminars in the CoR building. **The Meeting Place** is a networking platform for business, banks, Brussels based advocacy organisations and associations and regional investment and development agencies. The themes of the ‘**Meeting Place**’ are the same as the ones of the **OPEN DAYS 2009**. The seminars and workshops should be under the lead of a

company or financial institution. In 2009, there will be no thematic villages, only temporary exhibitions/stands around the seminars/workshops.

Organisational requirements:

Regional partnership representatives are expected to actively participate in the preparation and organisation of the OPEN DAYS – The Meeting Place and to attend all information/organisational meetings.

For each seminar (organised in cooperation with a company or a bank), one person must be designated as the main contact point as well as a second person replacing him/her. Both contact persons must attend information/organisation meetings and manage all coordination tasks with respective partners including:

- assuming responsibility for all organisational tasks such as providing requested information;
- active promotion of their own events

2.5 Benefits of participation

- Regions/cities within the selected regional partnership may use the label "*OPEN DAYS 2009 – European Week of Regions and Cities* PARTNER OFFICE" including the logo of the event for all their communication during 2009.
- Furthermore, regions/cities will receive all promotional materials (brochures, posters maps) produced by the CoR and DG REGIO thus enhancing the visibility of their offices among the EU institutions and local and regional actors, not only in Brussels but throughout the EU.
- Partner offices will be listed on a website devoted to the event, which can be linked to the offices' own websites.

2.6 Deadline for applications

Regional partners of regions and cities have to submit their applications before **Friday 13 March 2009** at the Committee of the Regions, rue Belliard 101, 1040 Brussels.

2.7 Selection procedure

Regional partners for 2009 will be selected by a jury composed of experts in the field of regional policy and representatives of organisers.

2.8 Announcement of results of the selection procedure

The list of regional partners and their partner offices selected to participate in the OPEN DAYS 2009 – European Week of Regions and Cities will be announced on 03 April 2009 and will be published on the OPEN DAYS website (www.opendays.europa.eu).

3. Practical details

3.1 The OPEN DAYS 2009 Conference Secretariat

The Conference Secretariat provides organisational support to the organisers, in particular as regards the online programme and registration of participants, speakers' and participants' requests, and the media programme.

3.2 Registration of participants

All event partners have to use the online registration system, which presents the only possibility to register to OPEN DAYS 2009 seminars held in Brussels.

Once registration opens in July 2009, all speakers and chairs should be registered by the regional partners for the workshops they are responsible for. This has not always been done in the past as most speakers/chairs assume they have automatically been registered.

The event partners are responsible for accepting registration requests for their seminars and for generating participants' lists. To comply with the existing legislation on the use of personal data of registered participants, the data may under no circumstances be stored after the event or used for other purposes than for identifying the seminar participants upon arrival. In particular, no lists of participants may be given to third parties.

To delegate the task of registering participants to the Conference Secretariat, they will be required to provide the Conference Secretariat with clear instructions on the acceptance criteria for their event.

All regional partners and partners will be trained in using the online registration system during the month of June 2009.

Local OPEN DAYS events in the member states will register participants by their own means.

Participants to the OPEN DAYS 2009 will be given just one personal badge when they first arrive, which indicates their name and organisation. They will use this badge throughout the event.

During the OPEN DAYS 2009, the event partners are held responsible for organising the registration and controlling the numbers of participants wishing to enter their seminars.

3.3 Communication aspects

The event partners agree to follow a common communication approach for the event by using the OPEN DAYS logo, website, newsletter and other tools. Due to limited resources, the language used for these tools will usually be English while the use of other languages is possible.

All event partners are encouraged to use as little paper copies and other material as possible. They are requested to use environmental friendly material for all products produced in relation to the event.

3.4 Media relations

In order to develop media awareness, the organisers will provide regular updates on the event through press releases etc. All event partners are requested to coordinate their media related activities and to use the same information sources such as the event's website and printed products and to ensure a coherence of messages.

For media participating in the OPEN DAYS, regional partners are requested to prepare an individual programme of events that includes visits to regional offices, the EU institutions and participation in workshops. Both the CoR and DG REGIO can assist in helping prepare these programmes.

During the event, a media centre will offer the possibility for TV productions. In this respect, cooperation will be sought for with European, national and regional media.

3.5 Documentation and evaluation

All event partners need to make sure that the final workshop titles, summaries and lists of speakers be submitted by **08 May 2009 at the latest** to facilitate the organisation of the programme.

Speakers' contributions such as articles, abstracts or power-point presentations should be sent to the Conference Secretariat by **4 September 2009**. All speakers' contributions will be made available on the OPEN DAYS website.

The organisers will provide a follow-up report, including a review of media activities and coverage. This report will be based on an online survey conducted among participants and input from regional partners, partners and others.

3.6 Other details

- Workshop chairs should be given the appropriate guidance beforehand to ensure that speakers keep to the imposed time limits and ensure sufficient time for discussion
- The organisers have the right to exclude regional partners and other partners from the list of event partners in case tasks as defined below will not be fulfilled on time (timeline in Section 3.2)
